

aces and merletti are the prince of artisanal products of the Island of Burano, of its history, tradition, and of the incredible talent of the inhabitants of the island: it is an art that has been passed down for centuries.

In Burano, the Bon family has been running "La Perla Gallery" shops for generations, a production reality that passes down the tradition of lace making



while maintain a local feel. A family of master lace makers that has designed, produced, and exhibited works of art for generations: entirely made by hand with needle, thread, and talent.

The workmanship is fascinating, and the final product is even more so: tablecloths, centerpieces,



linens, sheets, clothes, and dozens of other artistic "inventions". La Perla Gallery is also open as an exhibition space, where it is possible to attend the extraordinary production of original Burano lace, explained step-by-step by collaborators of the Bon family. Numerous masterpieces of manual talent are displayed inside the Gallery, and many famous visitors came here to discover this ancient art.





A purchase with an added value and a chance to return to society

Shirts, bags, and gift-ideas: through work, Rio Terà dei Pensieri Onlus promotes a return to "real life"

rganic garden, production of cosmetics, creation of accessories and bags from recycled materials and screenprinted t-shirts. With a special consideration for both the environment and the future, the cooperative Rio Terà dei Pensieri onlus supports the work of inmates and former inmates thus promoting their social reintegration. From April 2017 the non-profit organization also works together with the American artist Mark Bradford in Collective process, through which they promote the social reintegration of those who made some mistakes in the past.

The inmates, after a period of training, are hired by the cooperative as real workers: they receive a salary to support themselves, help families and contribute to their maintenance in prison.

Since 1994, Rio Terà dei Pensieri manages prison job, employing an average of twenty people between men and women inside, and about ten people outside as an alternative to detention.

Buying a product from the non-profit organization helps inmates in four ways, as the association explains: «Because an inmate who works experiences healthy relationships, learns, rebuilds a bridge with the world and his future and when he leaves prison, he is less likely to return to

Because you don't need a prison that punishes and humiliates, but a

prison that helps you not to repeat the same mistakes.

Because the prison economy has all the productive potential to contribute to the growth of the country, it is a virtuous, clean, supportive business.

Because the products made in prison are good and beautiful: carefully chosen raw materials, artisan processing methods and creativity make the final product an example of Italian production excellence».

Moving toward a brand-new-life: design and tailoring from prison, the fashion you don't expect

Shapes, colours, and textiles for social reintegration at II Cerchio onlus

Venetian shopping can have an "added value", too, if you choose the tailored garments of Banco Lotto nr10, at Castello 3478. Their tailored clothes are created in the Casa di reclusione Donne della Giudecca. For more than 20 years, the social cooperative II Cerchio has been working to promote social reintegration in Venetian correctional facilities. The non-profit organization offers stimulating work projects to the 232 inmates, thus giving those who have made mistakes in the past the chance to rebuild their future.

The cooperative works with many and prestigious partners in the lagoon area, such as Rubelli and Fortuny (who donate fabrics of high prestige and value), La Biennale di Venezia (which from 2013 grants a "temporary shop" on the occasion of the Venice Film Festival), the Fondaco dei Tedeschi (where the last collections of the atelier have been presented), the IED of Venice (through curricular projects) or volunteering associations like ${\bf Granello}$ di Senape and Closer.

Over the years, numerous fashion shows have been





organized: in 2015, the direction of the Correctional Institution for Women granted the permission for a fashion event in which both officers and inmates participated, in a location very much different from the usual catwalks.

Venice in a nutshell: 5 minutes for an informed visit

Perhaps you did not know that... Useful information to understand and enjoy the city

History

The most ancient findings in and around the Venetian lagoon date back to the period between the 10th and the 7th cent. BC.

According to the tradition, Venice was founded in 421 AD, which is the date of the first settlement on the islands of Rivo Alto (Rialto), from which the city expanded in the surrounding islands until it became today's Venice.

Venice developed under the Bizantine empire, but at the beginning of the 8th century it gained autonomy, and it became a full-fledged republic in the 12th century, governed by a Doge appointed for life.

Over the centuries, the Repubblica Serenissima di Venezia became a great trading and military power. It controlled the trading routes of the Mediterranean and it had an important position in the world's political balance, thanks to the strategic location of its ports, to its military and merchant fleet, to its diplomacy and secret intelligence.

In 828 AD, the remains of Mark the Evangelist were brought to Venice. From that moment, he became the patron saint of the city, and it symbol—the winged lion—became the symbol of the Serenissima.

Between the 13th and the 16th cent., the Serenissima ruled over Peloponnesus, Crete and Cyprus, the majority of Greek islands, many eastern Mediterranean cities and ports, as well as most of north-eastern Italy and of Istria and Dalmatia.

From the 16th cent., after the colonization of the Americas and the shift of the trading routes towards the West, Venice slowly started declining. After a history of 1100 years, 500 of which as a republic—the longest in history—Venice had now a weak government, incapable of fighting against its enemies, which eventually welcomed Napoleon during his campaign for promoting/imposing the republican ideals of the French Revolution. In 1797, despite the popular uprisings, the French troops entered the city. A few months later, Napoleon ceded Venice to Austria.

No longer a republic nor a maritime power, Venice became a bargaining chip between Austria and France until 1814, when it finally became part of the Austrian empire.

The 19th century was characterized by the insurrections for independence (Risorgimento) in Venice, as well as in the rest of Italy, until the plebiscite of 1866, through which Venice became officially part of the Regno d'Italia (Kingdom of Italy).

Geography



The Venetian lagoon is one of the biggest wetlands in Europe, with a 550 km2 surface, 8% of which is land. It is an extremely rich ecosystem where brackish water, fresh water, and sand meet to create an uncommon biodiversity (from mussels to flamingos).

The average depth of the lagoon is approx. 40 cm, therefore boats can go only in the canals. The tide rises and falls every 6 hours, letting many islands surface or submerging them. This phenomenon affects the historic center, too. In case of exceptional tide peaks (more than a meter above sea level), some calli (streets) or areas of the city can be submerged.

The historic center of Venice is in the middle of its lagoon. It is constituted by 118 small islands connected by 435 bridges—in stone, steel or wood—crossing 176 canals. It is connected to the mainland (Mestre and Marghera) through the Ponte della Libertà, a bridge almost 4 km long.

In ancient times, each small island used to have a campo (field) where to grow vegetables and keep small animals, one or more wells to gather rain water, an oven, some stores and a church. For this reason, squares in Venice are called "campi"—not "piazza" as in standard Italian. The only square in the city is Piazza San Marco. Streets used to be sparse and without pavement, therefore people moved mainly by boat. This is why the "real" Venetian streets are the canals and the Canal Grande is the main boulevard of the city.

We kindly invite you to always be respectful of the city, a unique and delicate world heritage site, and of its residents, who live side by side with millions of tourists every year.

Dangerous and indecorous behavior, as well as damages, are obviously subject to fines and expulsion measures.

What NOT to do in order to avoid being sanctioned:

- O dive and/or swim in the canals
- Olitter around, dirty walls and/or monuments
- Sit and eat in the monumental area of Piazza San Marco
- walk in the city in swimsuit or bare-chested
- O purchase from peddlers
- Oblock bridges and streets, and prevent other people's passage
- use and/or carry any type of bike
- O camp in the city

Walk around



- · When you walk, think of yourself as a car: keep right and do not stop where you may block passage through, such as on the narrow streets and on the bridges.
- Facilitate the passage of the locals, who may be working and therefore be in a
- Mind the hand trucks: they are the only means of transport of goods on the streets, and they can be bulky, especially in the narrowest passages.
- Public transportation lines (Actv) go along the Canal Grande and around the city, connecting it to the furthest islands of the lagoon, too. The service works 24/7. At night, rides are less frequent and not all the stops are open.
- You can easily explore the historic center on foot. However, if you wish to take the water bus to go around or visit the islands, the 24-hour (or more) passes can be very convenient.

Recommendations



- Getting lost in Venice is fun! After all, it is a small island and you never end up too far... Discover the hidden and quieter spots—you will not regret it!
- If you can stay for some days, think about visiting the islands of the lagoon. Almost all can be reached with public transportation, however, renting a boat can be a great way of experiencing the lagoon, too.
- Traditional venetian cuisine has many delicious dishes and Veneto region has some of the best wines in the world. Moreover, famous drinks such as the Bellini and the Spritz were born in Venice. And for dessert, do not forget the Tiramisù...
- · Look for artisan shops and buy original products: often they are unique pieces, always of great value.
- A guided tour with a qualified tourist guide is always a good way to learn about the city, its thousand-year old history and its traditions.
- If you wish to pic-nic or eat a packed lunch, you can go to the public gardens (check on the Comune di Venezia website for the map of green/rest areas), and not on the steps of monuments, churches, bridges, wells or canal banks.
- If you wish to go to the beach, visit the Lido and Pellestrina, where there are both free and equipped beaches.

Gioielli Nascosti di Venezia: five treasures off the beaten path

Fondazione Venezia Servizi presents a marvelous monumental collection of five historical venues called Gioielli Nascosti di Venezia (Hidden Jewels of Venice) linked with the history of the Venetian welfare. After decades of closing, these venues reopened to the public. A must-see tour for those who love the authentic Venetian heritage.

Scala Contarini del Bovolo

Scala Contarini del "Bovolo" (Venetian for "snail shell") is one of the unique examples of Venetian architecture of transition, from the traditionally well-rooted Venetian gothic to a more renaissance style (about 1499). Connected to the adjacent Palace through three loggias, the 26-meter-high staircase leads to the main floor where there are two exhibition halls and culminates, after 113

steps, on the Belvedere. From there, you can admire a beautiful and remarkable 360° view of Venice, including also St. Mark's Basilica, Doge's Palace, La Fenice Theatre, S. Maria della Salute Church



Oratorio dei Crociferi

Enclosed within an ancient building, Oratorio dei Crociferi enshrines an unexpected surprise: a small "treasure chest" decorated by Jacopo Palma il Giovane's canvases made at the end of the 16th century. The pictorial cycle deviates from official court painting, thus it presents a visual proof of the history and the protagonists of the religious order.





Complesso dell'Ospedaletto

Next to the Basilica of SS. Giovanni e Paolo, the Complesso dell'Ospedaletto was an important centre of music, devotion and assistance since the 16th century. Ospedaletto includes the baroque Church of Santa Maria dei Derelitti and Cortile delle Quattro Stagioni. Inside the historical building, you can admire the last Music Hall (Sala della Musica), which is an entirely frescoed masterpiece by Jacopo Palma il Giovane, that dates back to the 18th century.



Chiesa delle Zitelle

The project of the Church of Santa Maria della Presentazione, it is known as "Delle Zitelle" on the Giudecca island, is attributed to the genius of Andrea Palladio. An architectural masterpiece of the late 16th century that dominates the St. Mark's Basin and it is set between the two wings of the "hospice". The latter was founded in 1561 to welcome and educate young beautiful girls who risked being prostituted.





Chiesa di Santa Maria delle Penitenti

Located at the end of the Rio di Cannaregio and linked to a large hospital complex designed in the 18th century by the Venetian architect Giorgio Massari, Santa Maria delle Penitenti was erected in order to assist women wishing to start a new life after prostitution.

The Peggy Guggenheim **Collection celebrates** the "Dogaressa"

Thirty years of venetian history are on show through 60 masterpieces

hrough January 27th 2020, the Peggy Guggenheim Collection presents Peggy Guggenheim. The Last Dogaressa. This is an exhibition that celebrates the Venetian life of its founder, highlighting the events that marked the thirty years she spent in Venice, from 1948 to 1979, which proved to be authentic milestones in the history of 20th century art. The show focuses on Guggenheim's collecting after 1948, once she closed her museum/gallery Art of This Century (1942-47), left New York, and moved to Venice. More than sixty works by famous and lesser-known artists are exhibited, including paintings, sculptures, and works on paper selected from those Guggenheim acquired from the late 1940s through 1979, when she passed away.



The exhibition offers the opportunity to see famous masterpieces such as Empire of Light by René Magritte and Study for Chimpanzee by Francis Bacon, as well as works by Venetian artists such as Emilio Vedova and Edmondo Bacci. In addition, a selection of Guggenheim's scrapbooks are on display to the public for the first time. These are fascinating albums in which she meticulously collected newspaper articles, photographs, and ephemera covering the various periods of her life revealing new exciting episodes. Free tours of the show will be offered daily at 3.30pm (museum ticket purchase required). Among these, Meet the Curator consists in four appointments, included in the entrance ticket to the museum, with the curators Karole P. B. Vail, Director of the Museum, and Gražina Subelytė, Assistant curator, where public will deepen the contents of the exhibition and the curatorial choices.

Flemish art gets hold of the "Casa del Doge"

At the Doge's Palace the masterpieces of the Renaissance from Titian to Rubens

n an ideal bridge between Venice and Antwerp, **until 1st March 2020**, the magnificent *Doge's apartments* are transformed into veritable 'constkamers', rooms filled with exquisite art which show the richness of the Flemish collections. The Venetian

and Flemish Renaissance come to life at Palazzo Ducale thanks to the exhibition From Titian to Rubens.

Masterpieces from Antwerp and other Flemish collections.

Together with masterpieces by famous artists such as Titian, Peter Paul Rubens, Anthony van Dyck, Maerten de Vos and Jacques Jordaens, the exhibition brings to Italy a dazzling array of artworks of that period. Three icons of Venetian painting return to their Venetian hometown: Titian's Jacopo Pesaro, Bishop of Paphos, being

presented by Pope Alexander VI to Saint Peter, the altarpiece of the former San Geminiano church, advertised by the press worldwide as David Bowie's Tintoretto', and Titian's Portrait of a Lady and her Daughter (thought to be a depiction of Titian's mistress Milia and their daughter Emilia). Admire the beauty of the lagoon history in the renewed rooms open to the public

ew spaces for celebrating Giorgione, Bosch, Tiziano, Tintoretto, Veronese and many other masterpieces of the Venetian masters. This is what the Accademia Galleries inaugurated in the new layout of the VI-XI rooms dedicated to 16th century painting. 

Dolomiti d'Ampezzo, once coral reefs, today mountains

ortina d'Ampezzo, is the beating heart of the Ampezzo Dolomites. From all over the world tourists come to visit the city that rises at the heart of a set of mountains that creates a breathtaking view. However the Ampezzo area also offers a park that can further enhance the tourist experience in the Belluno area. Between Tofana, Croda Rossa and Cristallo, the park, entrusted by the Veneto Region to Regole d'Ampezzo, offers some of the most interesting and representative forest environments. «It is a unicum in Italy and it is a model that has been functioning very well for 30 years», as the director Michele da Pozzo notes.



The flora of the park extends between pine, larch and spruce, which currently exceed 200 years: «A habitat that is not even found in Trentino or South Tyrol», as the park director points out. This particular habitat allows different, rare and threatened species an ideal place where to live, among these are the capercaillie, the three-toed

woodpecker and the gray woodpecker, as well as the dwarf owl. The steep and sunny grasslands of the slopes host, among others, the rare quail king, and sometimes, it is possible to spot the white hare, the chamois and the white partridge, as well as the ibex, returned to populate the park for over twenty years. The typical inhabitant of the gorges is the eagle owl, while on the sunny cliffs the golden eagle and the woodpecker nest.

«Landscapes are undoubtedly the main source of attraction of all the Ampezzo



Dolomites, which is definitely one of the most beautiful places in the world. Interestingly, despite being one of the most touristic areas, there is still a lot of natural territory, a lot of fauna, therefore it is also a model of compatibility between tourism and wildlife. It is important that tourists respect the environment they are visiting, especially in the "hottest" moments, such as the summer and Christmas period», the director concludes.

of the he strength Dolomiti **Bellunesi** National Park lies the richness and rarity of its flora. Endemic and vascular flora provide a high phytogeographic value to the area, but what makes the visit even more particular is the possibility of observing




mammals such as chamois, deer, roe deer, mouflon, as well as foxes, ermines, martens and marmots from a short distance. In the park there are 42 species of mammals including bear, wolf, lynx and, since 2014, even the wild cat. For bird and birdwatching lovers it is possible to see, among the 14 species of birds, the eagle owl, the golden eagle and the dwarf owl. Another feature that makes the park unique is the "Erera-Brendol-Piani Eterni" upland. Inside it is possible to explore over 400 cavities between caves and abysses, with 35 kilometers of development and a depth of -1.052 meters.

In addition to flora, fauna and geology, the Belluno Dolomites also offer visitors other opportunities to have a good time. This because the environment, rich in glaciers and streams, allows people to fully immerse in nature, among trees, mountains and breathtaking views that will not fail to amaze.

Moreover it is also important the impact that man has had over the millennia within the

park areas, which today are mostly uninhabited.



«Certainly the national park and the fact of being a UNESCO site constitute a strong combination, perhaps underestimated in Italy, but which is very much appreciated by visitors from abroad. The park has many unique environmental features, both in terms of numbers and of species, which motivated the creation of preserved areas and the UNESCO. We need to work on encouraging the use of some parts of the park. There are niches of excellence, which, with the reintroduction of the wolf, make it possible to return to having all the animals present in past centuries in our territory», the president EnnioVigne explains.


